### May-August 1944

By the time July 1944 came, Lt-Col RSE Waterman had been the WNSR

Commanding Officer for seven months after taking command when Lt-Col Bogert was wounded bad enough to be replaced. At the beginning of July, this new CO would be recommended for the award of an "Immediate DSO" by Brigadier JPE Bernatchez, Comd of 3 Can Inf Bde for his actions in May on the Hitler Line. The last line in the recommendation reads, "Throughout the entire attack, Lieutenant Colonel WATERMAN's bravery and disregard for his own safety were an inspiration to all ranks of his unit." The Distinguished Service Order (DSO)



is an award for high gallantry, just short of

the Victoria Cross. In May, led by Lt-Col Waterman, the West Novas had been part of the push to break the Gustav Line and the Adolph Hitler Line.

These were tremendously difficult battles as the Germans were now without their Italian allies and were fighting desperately to keep us away from the back door to Germany. The price in West Nova lives for May '44 was 50 (1 Lt, 1 Sqt, and 48 Junior Ranks). There were two other Ptes wounded in late May who died in June. I have no count of the numbers wounded, captured, or MIA. June 6<sup>th</sup> saw

the unit move south to a rest area, and the next day, they were all issued with new berets. On the 16<sup>th</sup> there were recreational tours of Naples and Pompeii, places these boys from Nova Scotia and other parts of Canada had never thought they'd see. Then, on the 19<sup>th</sup> a leave party left for Rome, the Eternal City. On the 10<sup>th</sup> of July, qualifying personnel were awarded the 1939-43 Star, and on the 24<sup>th</sup> there were 25 men confirmed by the Bishop of Lichfield in Rome. Then, as before, came the dreaded time to get back to the bloody business of war.

The Battalion was now set to engage in the Battle of the Gothic Line moving into August. On the 8<sup>th</sup>, they moved to an area near Florence, the 9<sup>th</sup> to Sienna, the 10<sup>th</sup> to Perugia, and the 20<sup>th</sup> to an area near lesi. On the 26<sup>th</sup> the unit received official notification that Lt-Col Waterman would receive the DSO, and Sqt LJ Newcombe, Sqt A Vingar, and L/Sqt RT McKinnon would each be awarded the Military Medal for their actions in the Battle for the Hitler Line. The weather was fine and warm, and Padre Wilmot, labelled by the men as the "fighting padre", arranged for communion services in the Coy areas. As the WNSR War Diary says, "Light shelling during the early evening but there were no casualties." On the 29<sup>th</sup> of August, the battalion was placed on four hours notice to move before they were sent to relieve the 48<sup>th</sup> Highlanders overlooking the River Foglia in area 0772. The Battle of the Foglia River had begun.

For those interested in the historic lineage of the Regiment, we've inserted an outline on the next page to show our roots. Some say, our lineage goes back even further to the British Army Regiment the 40<sup>th</sup> Regiment of Foot, raised in 1717 at Fort Anne in Annapolis Royal. They were British Regulars while our heritage has always been in the line of the local militia soldiers defending home and hearth; however, I would say that the settlers they recruited in Annapolis and surrounding areas would be members of the local militia, so we "do" have a strong and recognizable connection.

#### News from the Unit

This was also a well attended parade with Hon Col Don Downe in the front row as well as a number of RA members.

#### Unit Training and Highway Naming

The Bn HQ will be operating to administer the unit members wherever they are for their training, but the unit will be dispersed either giving or receiving training. The new recruits will be completing basic training planned for them, and the second year FTSE members will complete individual trades training appropriate to their level of expertise.

Late August will see members of the unit engaged in the annual field exercise planned by 5 Can Div in CFB Gagetown, most likely in an area where many of you have eyeballed the scenery and taken cover in the shrubbery.

Upon their return to Aldershot, they'll have about two weeks before they provide support for our 70<sup>th</sup> Annual WNSRRA Reunion. Most people wouldn't notice, but your Regiment provides significant support in the background to help the RA put on a good reunion.

This year, the 150<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Regiment, we will be given the honour of having NS Highway 10 from Middleton to Bridgewater named "West Nova Scotia Regiment Way" in honour of West Novas who have served Canada and Canadians. The final date for the ceremony has not been determined yet, but it would be proper to have a significant representation from the Regimental Association present. I know there will be whenever it happens because we're Always Faithful. This is a tremendous honour for our Regiment, one I'm sure other units will envy and try to imitate; however, West Novas lead the way, just like we did during the Invasion of Italy. Keep an eye on your email because you'll be informed as soon as I am. We need our membership out in numbers for this historic day. Don't miss it. We'll sure need a group photo for this event.

### On Loan from the Canadian War Museum to WNSR Museum Exhibit



Throughout the winter, three folks have been working diligently to obtain West Nova WWII artifacts from the Canadian War Museum (CWM): Garry Randall, Tom Stinson, and Janice Slauenwhite.

Garry visited the CWM and found Padre Wilmot's helmet, armband, and Red Cross flag and made inquiries about borrowing these items to display in our exhibit at the Macdonald Museum. He was joined in his efforts complete the formal request to bring these items to Nova Scotia by Janice, Director of the Macdonald

Museum, and Tom, former West Nova CO and 36 CGB Comd.

They filled out plenty of government forms and answered long lists of questions before the CWM staff would consider whether or not to lend us the artifacts which the Padre had donated to the CWM. I'm happy to say that the hard work and determination of our team to obtain these items was successful, and you can see them in our exhibit when you come to the Reunion in September.

The photo is from the inside cover of *Testaments of Honour: Personal histories of Canadian war veterans,* by Blake Heathcote. Hon Capt Padre LF Wilmot, MC sits in the Coliseum in Rome on leave, probably in June 1944. The book is a collection of the stories of 24 Canadian War

veterans: the first and last are West Novas -- Alex MacInnis and Laurence Wilmot, MC.

#### Historical Note

Prior to the Korean War, all chaplains held honorary ranks until that was changed through the efforts of another West Nova, BGen RGC Cunningham who was a WWII PI Comd, a jump-gualified Korean War chaplain with 2PPCLI, and later the Chaplain General (Protestant) for the CF (1973-76). After retirement, BGen Cunningham served as WNSR Honorary Colonel (1986-90) and President of the Regimental Association (1991-93).

The Military Medal (MM) was a military decoration awarded to personnel of the British Army and other arms of the armed forces, and to personnel of other Commonwealth countries, below commissioned rank, for bravery in battle on land. The award was established in 1916, with retrospective application to 1914, and was awarded to other ranks for "acts of gallantry and devotion to duty under fire".

Listed here are the names of the 16 West Nova soldiers who were awarded the MM, listed by the date won. The ranks listed are the ranks held when the soldier earned his



MM. The only exception is Cpl JW Marshall who earned his first MM as a Pte and seven months later earned another as a Cpl.

Each has a separate tale of courage under fire in Italy or Northwest Europe. Each recipient is a citizen soldier who volunteered to serve his country and did so in an exemplary manner in the face of the enemy.

It is our plan to tell the stories of these men in subsequent issues of the RA Newsletter so that we can share the history of our Regiment with our members and their friends and families.
