In command of the party was Major M.G. Clennett and the following Officers were included: Capt G.S. Bauld, Capt. R.P. Beadon, Capt. R.S. Blair, Capt. A. McNeil, Major H.V. Davies, Lt. Greeno, Lt. Matheson. Lt. Col. J.H. Gowen had arrived two or three days before, having been placed in command of the West Nova Scotia Regiment, Pacific Force. This draft arrived at Debert and were all originals from Draft C.D. 45 which was formed in Holland at Nymagen, some six weeks previously. No. 2 Trans. Camp at Debert is providing a system of Hotel Service during the formation of the Battalion. Major Harold Jones from Halifax is Liaison Officer, and his staff consists of several clerks, cooks, etc., and one batman. The hotel service provided for all rations and accommodations.</p>

The remainder of the Battalion were employed on sports, drill and route marches. Ten other ranks were posted A.W.L. and seven other ranks awarded punishments. Debert, NS	14 Aug 45		<p>All during the day rumors have been coming in that the war with Japan is over and the bar has been opened on several occasions due to these false alarms. A riot squad has been organized under the command of Lt. Senior with twenty other ranks, who have been standing to all day in order that they may quell and repetition the V-E Day riots at a moments notice. At about 9.00 in the evening word came in that the Liquor store in Truro was threatened. The riot squad was rushed to the scene, and apart from one broken window, damage was prevented. Our squad was the first to arrive on the scene, and forming a semi-circle around the Liquor Store, and taking the scabards off their bayonets caused the crowd to melt quickly away. The one broken window was unfortunately caused by one of our own men. In spite of rumors coming in all day, the men were employed as usual on squad drill, obstacle course, training films and organized sports.</p>	<i>Rtd</i>

Major Castonguay has been attached to Regimental Headquarters for duty as S 3 and Capt Blair has taken over K Coy. A message was received to the effect that all movement of posted personnel will discontinue from district depots to Unit Assembly Areas, but in spite of this, personnel are dribbling in two and threes. The percentage of A.W.L. is still high, in spite of six more OR's being awarded Detention. The figure now stands at 35 against a strength of 412. The Regimental Commander held a conference of Battalion Commanders and Adjutants to discuss the taking on strength of all reinforcements in our lines. It was decided to transfer only those personnel for whom the bodies could be produced, leaving the Transit Camp to deal with absentees, which would be taken on strength only after their return and disciplinary action had been taken. The date for the transfer was decided to be the first of Sept, 1945 in view of pay complications.

A dental parade was held today and now all personnel on strength have been checked by the dental Officer. The Regimental Commanders held a conference with all Battalion Commanders and Adjutants, at which Col. Dunn, O.C. 2nd Ech was present. He stated that the future of the C.A.P.F. had not yet been decided and was ~~been~~ <sup>BEING</sup> held in abeyance due to political negotiations with the U.S.
